

Family Peer Specialist – Wraparound with Intensive Services (WISe)

Working with the Recovery Model of Care and the System of Care Values and Principles, the WISe Family Certified Peer Counselor provides peer support services to up to 10 parents/legal guardians of children and youth enrolled in the Passages' WISe program. The WISe Family CPC is part of a WISe team.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

A. Clinical Services: The WISe Family Peer Counselor will:

- 1) Lived experience as a parent/ caregiver of a child in the public mental health system.
- 2) Model and teach behaviors that lead to healthy choices, the development of healthy advocacy, resiliency, and recovery.
- 3) Provide one-on-one peer support to assist primary caregivers of SCRBHO WISe enrolled children (0-20) in realizing the goals identified in their WISe treatment plan as developed by the child's WISe team.
- 4) Accompany primary caregivers of SCRBHO WISe enrolled children (0-20) to WISe team meetings and other system meetings as requested by the primary caregiver.
- 5) Facilitate Wellness Recovery Action Plans as requested by the primary caregiver of a WISe enrolled child (0-20).
- 6) Assist primary caregivers of SCRBHO WISe enrolled children (0-20) in developing informal resources, natural supports, and reducing system dependency.
- 7) Refer and link primary caregivers of SCRBHO WISe enrolled children (0-20) to local and statewide services as appropriate.
- 8) Provide culturally appropriate services.
- 9) Be respectful of youth and family voice, culture, and strengths during all phases of the wraparound process.
- 10) Work with the WISe Administrator and the WISe Clinical Supervisor to develop peer-facilitated psychoeducation for parents/legal guardians of WISe enrollees.
